

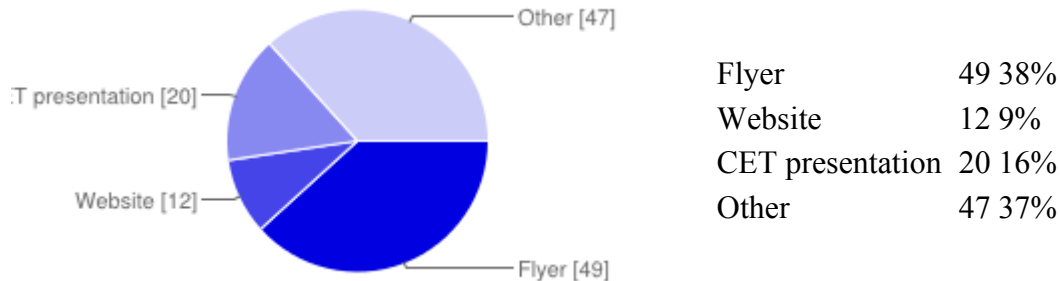

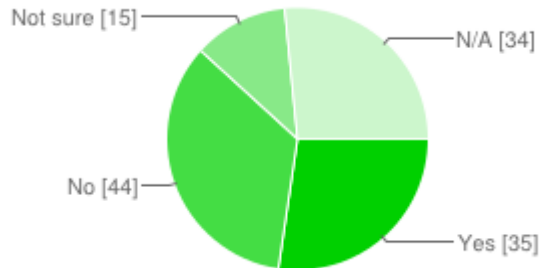

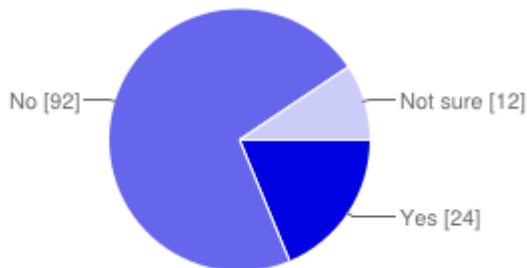

6. Do you attend training sessions?

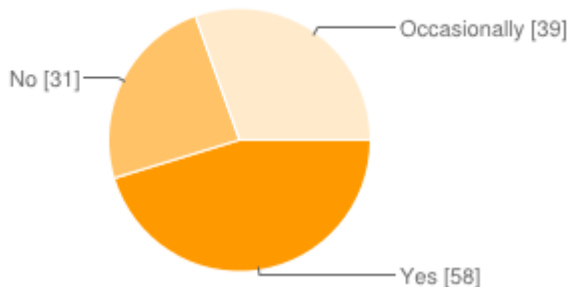
