OVERVIEW | THESIS STATEMENT

Outdoor wayside exhibits in natural parks provide historical and ecological information to visitors as they encounter the park landscape. While these exhibits offer site-based information, they fall short in **facilitating a sense of connection and emotional investment** between visitor and place.

As a mediator between visitors and the environment, wayside exhibits can be designed to reflect both entities through integrative placemaking strategies, enacted through site-specific engagements, interpretive storytelling, and directed facilitation between audiences.

Implementing these placemaking strategies can connect visitors to their environment and cultivate a grounded connection to the park landscape in tandem with the experience. In doing so, wayside exhibits can **provide a sense of place** that contributes to a **deeper understanding of local ecological narratives for multi-generational visitors.**

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

A BEAST UNTO ITSELF - THE FLORIDA EVERGLADES

"The Everglades is a subtropical wetland ecosystem spanning two million acres across central and south Florida. During the wet season, Lake Okeechobee overflows, releasing water into a very slow moving, shallow river dominated by sawgrass marsh—dubbed the "river of grass." The water flows southward, passing through diverse habitats, including cypress swamps, wet prairie, and mangroves, until it reaches Everglades National Park and eventually Florida Bay." - National Wildlife Federation

Waterways have been a resource for survival and storytelling. Across the centuries, we've been able to extrapolate gods and monsters from a bountiful ocean and cast them as our protectors, creators, and ultimate harbingers of destruction. Monsters and deities are formative in understanding our cultural identities through story and bleed into our ideas of religion, folklore, mythology, and survival. Because of this, they are intrinsically linked to storytelling, particularly as foundational texts for survivalist morals.

"The River has Teeth" is an outdoor exhibition that examines our relationship to the water within the context of this complex ecosystem to look at ongoing issues affecting this living organism. Using monsters as an interpretive technique frames our understanding of ongoing daunting and urgent issues as ones that can be faced with creativity, self-actualization, and interpersonal relevance. Visitors will understand the importance of water and the ongoing need to protect it, so it can continue to create stories for future centuries.

PRIMARY AUDIENCE

Local Multi-Generational Families (Rechargers, Experience Seekers)

Multi generational and first time audiences are a large portion of park attendance (via 2002 Data survey report.) Multi-generational families are defined by a large party, typically consisting of an adult and child, and can be extended to include grandparents and extended family members. These visitors are looking for a day trip filled with recreation, fresh air, and family time away from the city. Designing for this audience means creating dynamic and engaging experiences for everyone in the group. Within designing for this group is an opportunity to facilitate conversation and connection within the party. To ensure multi-lingual accessibility to local families, English and Spanish will be used throughout the exhibit.

SECONDARY AUDIENCE

Adventurers, Campers, Bird Watchers (Hobbyists, Experience Seekers)

Wilderness Hobbyists see the park at its closest as they kayak, hike, and camp within the landscape. Unlike the typical day trip group, this audience does the work to see the park at the earliest of hours and latest of evenings. These travelers come for adventurous spirits outside of the typical car travel. They are more daring and willing to explore new (and possibly dangerous) experiences. Designing for this audience means creating new experiences that don't already exist within the park. Where will adventure be found?

Local School Groups w/ Staffed Facilitators, Educators, etc.

As the quintessential K-12 field trip, a visit to Everglades National Park brings students outside of the classroom setting to learn the curriculum first hand. These groups are large and require flexibility consisting of students, along with facilitated chaperones, park staff, and educators. Designing for this group means creating meaningful experiences that leave a lasting memory and foundational care for the environment. Coordinated through park outreach coordinators, this audience is provided a curriculum beforehand to properly orient students before their trip.

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
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
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

- Directions to Trail: Seven miles (11km) north of the Flamingo Visitor Center on the main park road.







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

STORY AS INTERPRETER

By contextualizing Everglades National Park as different from the known picturesque landscape, visitors understand the park as a complex and highly developed space with a long history (and ongoing present) of human intervention and ecological change. Bringing these unseen narratives into the park landscape can draw immediate understandings relative to the visitor's surroundings.

STORY AS FACILITATOR

Storytelling can facilitate connection between visitors and allow them to synthesize information and understandings in a group setting. By allowing room for facilitated conversation and activity, visitors can make connections and continue conversations past the exhibit site.

STORY AS WITNESS

Integrating local perspectives acknowledges the people living in and around the park. As the Everglades, historically, included the entirety of South Florida, blurring the line between park grounds and urbanized spaces through the use of first-hand perspectives reminds visitors that connection to the Everglades does not stop at the park boundary.

STORY AS CONTRIBUTER

Visitors reassess their own day-to-day environmental practices and the motivations behind them. In an effort to fight against feelings of hopelessness and powerlessness, visitors can feel emboldened to take small action when framed to help a collective legacy. By framing social action as part of the park's environmental mission, visitors contribute to the story of ongoing conservation.



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

INTERPRETIVE APPROACH

Driving off the main park road, visitors dive head first into the mystical waters of The River Has Teeth. In this outdoor exhibition, monsters and beasts of the Florida Everglades have revealed themselves to teach visitors about the ongoing ecological issues affecting the largest subtropical wilderness in the United States. Visitors learn about each monster and an associated ongoing park-related issue, all of which center on water as a key theme. Each concept area features a passport activity and call-to-action station where visitors pledge to be ecological stewards of the park's future.

On the West Lake trail, visitors continue exploring as they traverse the mangrove forest boardwalk to find monsters lurking in the woods. They conclude the trail overlooking the grandeur of West Lake where they can reflect on lessons learned and appreciate nature in the present.

EXHIBITION NARRATIVE

"Among the mangroves and wetlands of the Florida Everglades, towering creatures emerge from the brackish wilds. The fragile ecosystem hangs in the balance of these guardians. While some are fierce protectors, others are transformed by the imbalance of dangerous environmental mistreatment. These monsters and beasts embody the beauty and risks facing this threatened ecosystem. In their presence, we are reminded that the Everglades relies on our care and action to restore that balance."

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

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
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OO | DRIVING HEAD FIRST



Driving Head-First

Off the two-lane Main Park Road, visitors see the initial entry signage and turn into the initial exhibit entry. A large canopy brings guests underwater- specifically through Lake Okeechobee. The canopy above creates fish and water pattern shadows projected onto the road and cars that drive through it. While there are no indications of monsters or beasts, this entry sets the initial immersive tone moving forward- differentiating itself from the typical park trail.

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
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
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OIA | INTO THE BRACKISH WILDS



The River has Teeth

Visitors see the tail of a brown water snake just as it slithers back into the mangrove forest. This giant snake has its tail wrapped around a nearby observation tower as visitors are able to walk underneath its lifted body. Through this entry gate, visitors enter the world of larger-than-life monsters found within the exhibit.

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
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OIB | OBSERVATION TOWER



Wrapped around the snake's tail is the open-air observation tower. This wooden tower invites guests to climb the stairs to see the park from above. In the Everglades, the topography changes by the inch and here visitors can take in views above the tree line to overlook West Lake, the River has Teeth, and more.

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

Meet the Giants

From the entry, visitors make direct eye contact with the fearsome alligator located central to the exhibit. This large scale alligator can be seen from all sides of the exhibit from its head, body, and tail. Visitors are encouraged to play, climb, and meet this formidable reptile. Visitors will feel adventurous as they climb the alligator and explore the different parts of the area.

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
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

Share Stories

After encountering the alligator below, visitors walk up to the raised chickee hut which provides panoramic views of the exhibit from an elevated space. Visitors discover that this space is more than just a covered area, but in fact is the alligators nest and that the alligator below is a mother protecting her eggs. In this storytelling space, visitors are safe to relax and converse with one another through questioning prompts about water embedded into the ground.

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
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03 | BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR - SUGAR CANE FARMING



Listen to Stories

Within the burnt sugar cane fields, visitors can activate speakers to listen to first hand accounts of local residents to that are affected by sugar cane burning in the Everglades Agricultural Area (EAA). These stories tell the visitor about unforeseen and ongoing health issues caused by this dangerous agricultural practice. Shade devices throughout the activity area cast menacing shadow faces onto different surfaces throughout the day.

With its towering stalks and long leaves, the sugar cane monster rises from the scorched earth of the sugar cane field. After consuming precious water from Lake Okeechobee, it releases clouds of thick smoke and fire to make the sugar that feeds its insatiable appetite. This fearsome being stands as a reminder of the sacrifices made in the name of agriculture, warning all who witness it that the price of sweetness can come at the cost of harming others.

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
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
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
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04 | SEVERED CONNECTIONS - THE PANTHER



Walk the Path

Visitors see a fragmented walking path representative of wildlife crossings throughout the park. Visitors walk the path and encounter large-scale panther lenticulars with large graphic rounds that regale the development and dangers that came with the creation of Tamiami Trail and I-40. Visitos will experience the arduous task that is having to circumnavigate around the metaphorical highway above.

The Florida panther wanders the Everglades at night. When highways and interstates were carved through the Everglades, it severed not only the flow of water but the paths of life for the panther's territory. Now, the panther watches through the hammocks, waiting for its fragmented home to be made whole again.

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
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OS | A RETURN TO FLOW - THE ANHINGA



Tracking Changes

Visitors encounter a large anhinga with two slot puzzles that map the historic and current flow of water throughout the Everglades. A wooden anhinga is used as the guiding piece for visitors to understand how water divertment has left the Everglades a parched landscape.

Soaring above the Everglades and swimming through its waters, the Anhinga opens its wings to observe all changes to the ecosystem. Once following the unrestrained flow of the water from Lake Okeechobee to Florida Bay, the anhinga has been an aerial spectator of the water's transformation into canals, reservoirs, and farmland. With a now disturbed flow of water, the anhinga is left confused looking for paths it once knew but can no longer find.



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

Match the Rounds

Visitors encounter two giant Tarpons as they roll up from the water. Here, visitors learn about the balance between saltwater, freshwater, and brackish water in the Everglades. Rotating the gradient disk will show four different sides, representing the different types of water. As visitors work together to get the fish all the same material, hollow marbles inside keep the rounds spinning.

The tarpon glistens like a jewel as it rolls to the surface of Florida Bay. This giant fish thrives in the balance of brackish (saltwater and freshwater) water. But as saltwater creeps deeper into freshwater ecosystems, the tarpon senses the growing imbalance in its world. Now it calls on us to restore the balance before it's too late so the Everglades can shine like a jewel once more.

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

Brackish Barrel

From one side to another, visitors can walk along the oil barrel display to see acryllic images of fish that span from freshwater to brackish water saltwater. With name and visual identifiers, visitors will understand the reliance of balanced ecosystems required for different sealife.

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
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07 | GREEN ISNT ALWAYS GOOD - THE MANATEE



Seagrass Dilemma

Enter the comfort station, visitors see large algae blooms with harmful facts hanging above them. In this dying seagrass field, manatees glow with toxic patterns crossing their skin. Questions and mirrors on the panels ask visitors to empathize with creatures unable to get food due to agricultural consequence.

Once a peaceful giant grazing the seagrass floor, the manatee has transformed into a monstrous being, corrupted by the toxic algae blooms that choke the Everglades' waters. Driven mad by the toxins, it now warns all who enter that neglecting the waters can turn even the gentlest creatures into something dark and destructive.



At the round signage, visitors learn about the importance of seagrass and the harm of toxic algae. As the lowest on the food chain, importance is placed on the quality of water needed for it to grow. Visitors can pick up viewfinders that are cabled to the reading area and look onto West Lake to see different creatures emerging from the water.

Once a peaceful giant grazing the seagrass floor, the manatee has transformed into a monstrous being, corrupted by the toxic algae blooms that choke the Everglades' waters. Driven mad by the toxins, it now warns all who enter that neglecting the waters can turn even the gentlest creatures into something dark and destructive.

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

Mangrove Stroll

As visitors enter the interpretive trail they are immersed in a lush forest of mangroves. As they walk the trail, three types of nodes along the trail highlight the different type of mangrove and how they are protectors of the shore and ecosystem at large. These nodes are representative of each type of mangrove (black, red, and white). As an addition to the existing trail, visitors see and listen to the forest as they navigate through giant tree roots, pneumataphors, and canopies.

Black, Red, and White Mangrove were three siblings and protectors of the Everglades' shores. Black thrived in the harsh, muddy water, Red flourished in the deeper waters where the tide met the land, and White stood tall in the higher, calmer places where the saltwater barely touched their roots. The siblings work together to protect the coastline from storms, provide homes for a plethora of creatures, and clean the water for everyone in the ecosystem.
