

Amendment to Charter

THE EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION FOR THE FASHION INDUSTRIES

THIS INSTRUMENT WITNESSETH That the Regents of The University of the State of New York have amended the charter of The Educational Foundation for the Fashion Industries, located in the city, county and State of New York, which was granted by the Board of Regents on April 21, 1944, under the corporate name of The Educational Foundation for the Apparel Industry, and amended by the Regents on March 26, 1965 by changing the name of the corporation from The Educational Foundation for the Apparel Industry, to The Educational Foundation for the Fashion Industries, by increasing the maximum authorized number of trustees of the corporation to 60.



Granted July 25, 1980 by the Regents of The University of the State of New York and executed under the seal of said University.



Absolute charter of

The Educational Foundation for the Apparel Industry

This instrument witnesseth That the Board of Regents for and on behalf of the

Education Department of the State of New York has granted this absolute charter


incorporating Max Meyer, Morris W. Hoff, Julius Hochman, Betty Haudley Densally, Mortimer C. Ritter, Samuel Zahn and Charles S. Zimmerman and their associates and successors as an educational corporation, under the corporate name of The Educational Foundation for the Apparel Industry, the operations of the corporation to be conducted principally in the City of New York, with fifteen directors, to be at first Max Meyer, Morris W. Hoff, Samuel Zahn, Walter V. Marks, Julius Green, Fiegel Levine, Julius Hochman, Nahasied Spector and Teichberg, Betty Haudley Densally, Mortimer C. Ritter, Morgan Zimmerman, Charles S. Zimmerman, Samuel L. Delsch and Max Zaritsky, to hold until their successors shall be chosen by members of the corporation, with power thereunto to increase or decrease its membership in such manner and upon such terms as the by-laws of the corporation shall provide, and with power in the directors, from time to time, by unanimous vote of their full board, to fix their terms of office and their number, to be not more than twenty-five nor less than ten.

The purposes and objects of the corporation shall be:

- A. To assist the Board of Education of the City of New York and any other public education authority, governmental agency or corporation chartered by the Board of Regents in:
 - (1) planning, establishing and maintaining a fashion institute of technology and design, or similar institution, for the dress, cloak and suit industry, men's clothing, fur, shoes and leather goods, undergarments, and the allied and other apparel trades;
 - (2) developing a modern curriculum for such institute on a post-secondary school or college level and conducting the same for men and women who have graduated from secondary schools or who have acquired sufficient education with approved experience in the industry;
 - (3) bringing to such institute the joint support of labor and industry to develop from the talented youth of today the leaders of tomorrow in the constant climb to greater ideals and higher levels of achievement; honor and prestige for the needle and apparel trades and for a cultured, enlightened, civic-minded, economically secure citizenry engaged therein;
- B. To plan and develop for the youth of the needle trades now engaged in the armed forces of our country, or in defense work in support thereof, postwar programs that will afford educational opportunities to keep alive and to stimulate their civic, social, aesthetic and cultural consciousness, and to assist them in regaining and developing their means for economic security;
- C. For the accomplishment of the aforesaid objects, to establish branch organizations, to print, publish, bind and distribute such books, magazines, papers and other literature and to direct, conduct or assist in radio, television, dramatic, music or such other programs as will further carry out the objects of this corporation.

The corporation hereby created shall be a nonstock corporation organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes, and no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any individuals; and no officer, member or employee of the corporation shall receive or be entitled to receive any pecuniary profit from the operations thereof, except reasonable compensation for services.
